Q: What is 'normalcy'?

## Admission Criteria & Application Process



Criteria:

- Must be between 16-21
- Be homeless, an unaccompanied alien minor, or receiving Foster Care services
- Must have no history of sexual offenses
- Must be in an educational program and employed or volunteering
- Must be willing and able to: complete Program Goals, follow policies, engage in self-discovery, accept criticism, and practice maturity

Application Process:

- Application packet
- Written letter of interest by applicant explaining why they think this program would benefit them, what they hope to accomplish, and how they intend to give back to their community.
